

WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR WEEE?



Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) is a dangerous waste category and must therefore be subject to specific regulations. It must be collected and processed in a transparent, sustainable and efficient way in accordance with the waste product legislation. You should therefore always work with a recognised transporter and a licensed processor.

This document gives you a schematic and concise presentation of how Recupel can help you with the collection and processing of your WEEE.

It is important that you make a distinction between household and professional WEEE.

In case of doubt, you have the following options:

→ Look for the appliance on the product lists at [www.recupel.be/Contribution/Product lists](http://www.recupel.be/Contribution/Product%20lists): these product lists are subdivided according to the 10 European WEEE categories. Within each category you have domestic (orange) and professional (green) subcategories. The product list of household appliances with an all-in contribution is an exhaustive list. The product list of professional appliances with an administrative contribution is an illustrative list.

→ Look for the appliance using our Product Search Engine at www.recupel.be

In the event that your search does not return any results, this may mean either that the appliance is not present on the household exhaustive lists or that it is not expressly mentioned on the professional illustrative lists. However, this does not exclude your product from falling under the take-back obligation.

→ If you cannot find the appliance on the product lists or via the product search engine, fill in the contact form on our website and attach a product sheet.

Does your WEEE belong within the household categories?

- become a Recupel collection point: see www.recupel.be/Collection/Retailers,
- provided the collection conditions are complied with, Recupel organises the collection of your household WEEE free of charge. You can also contact a used-good centre in your neighbourhood (if the appliance still works) or you can always contact a private transfer station directly.

If you are an electronic goods retailer, you are eligible for distribution compensation.

To register as a Recupel collection point for household WEEE and/or as an end user of professional WEEE, go to www.recupel.be. From the left-hand menu bar select 'Affiliation & login' and choose the desired affiliation. Are you already affiliated and would you like to extend the service provision to other product categories? Call the Operations department on 0800 403 88.



Does your WEEE belong within the professional categories?

In this case you have 2 options:

- you can call on the Recupel collector/charter operator: see the Recupel charter at [www.recupel.be/Professional appliances/Recupel charter](http://www.recupel.be/Professional%20appliances/Recupel%20charter).
- you can opt for the paid Recupel 'full option service' (for this, contact your importer/manufacturer): in this case Recupel also sees to the collection and processing of your professional WEEE. You therefore do not have to conclude an agreement with a collector/charter operator yourself.
